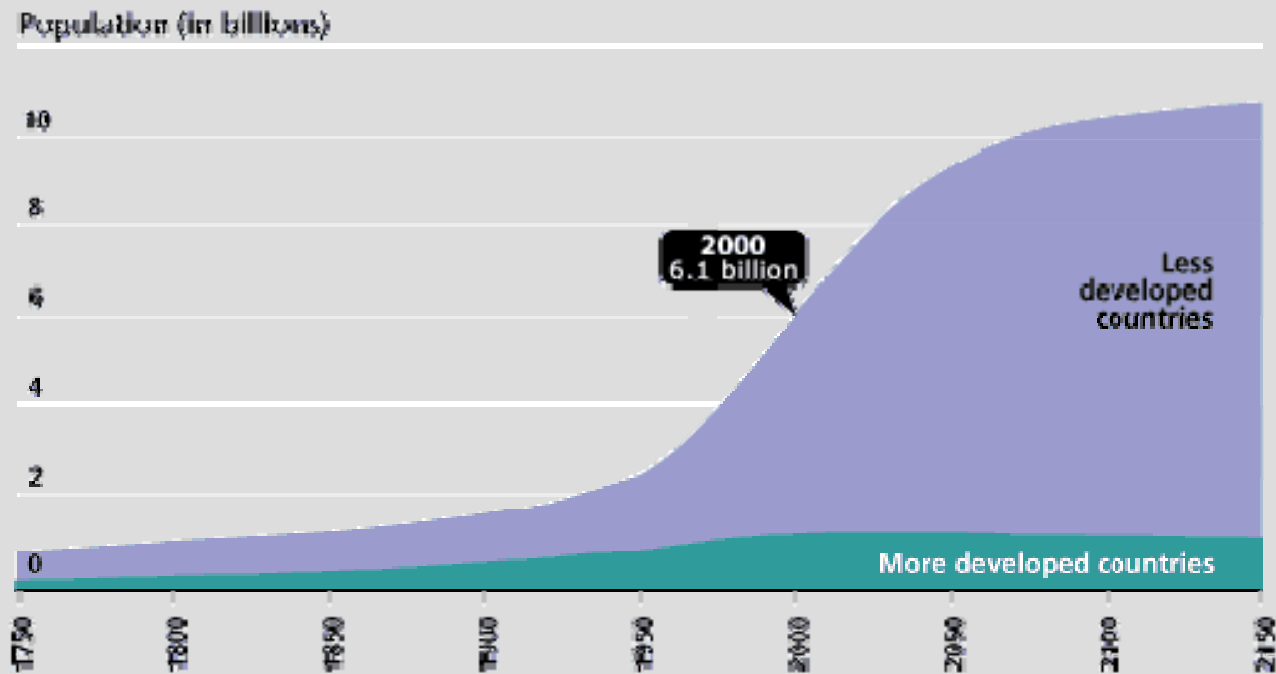

World population growth, 1750–2150

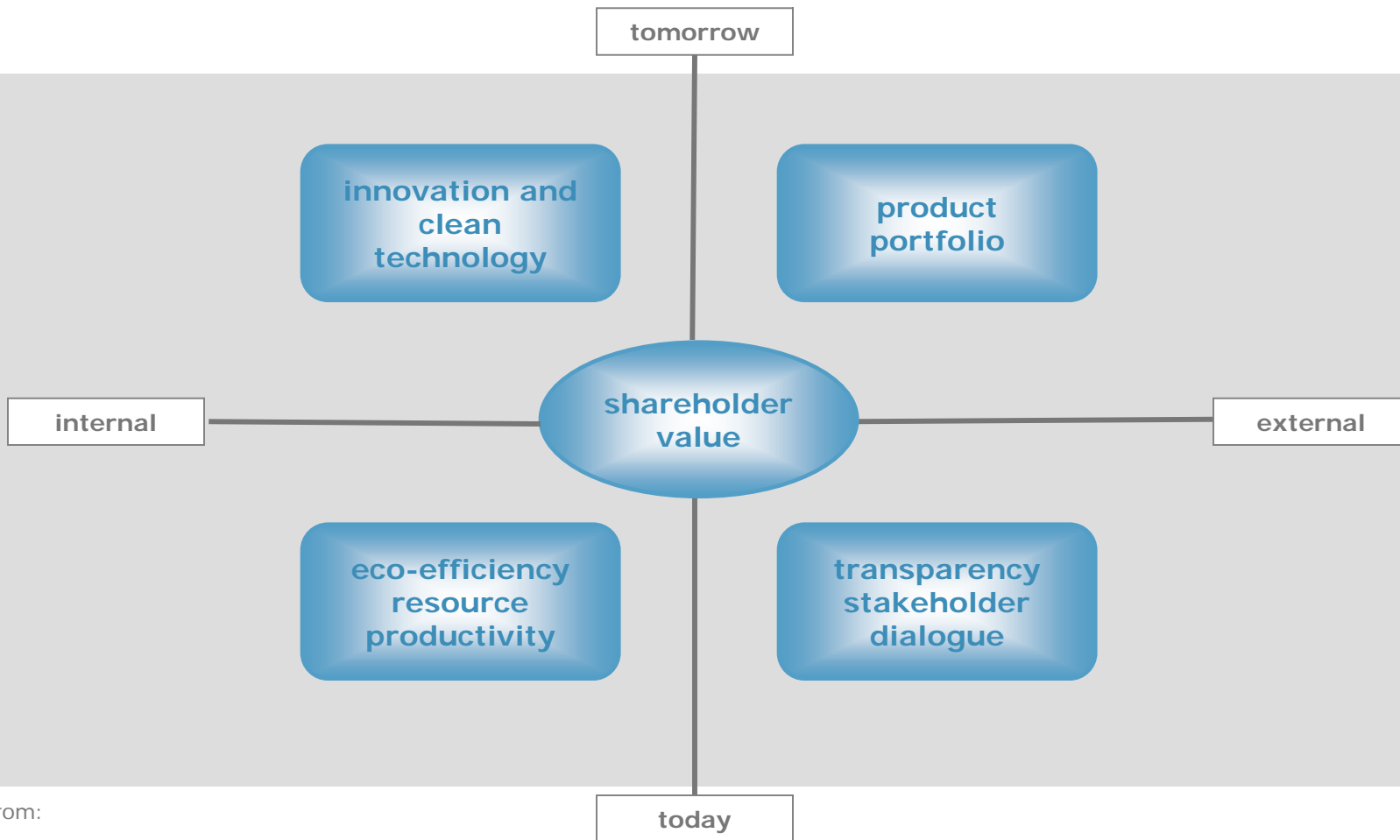

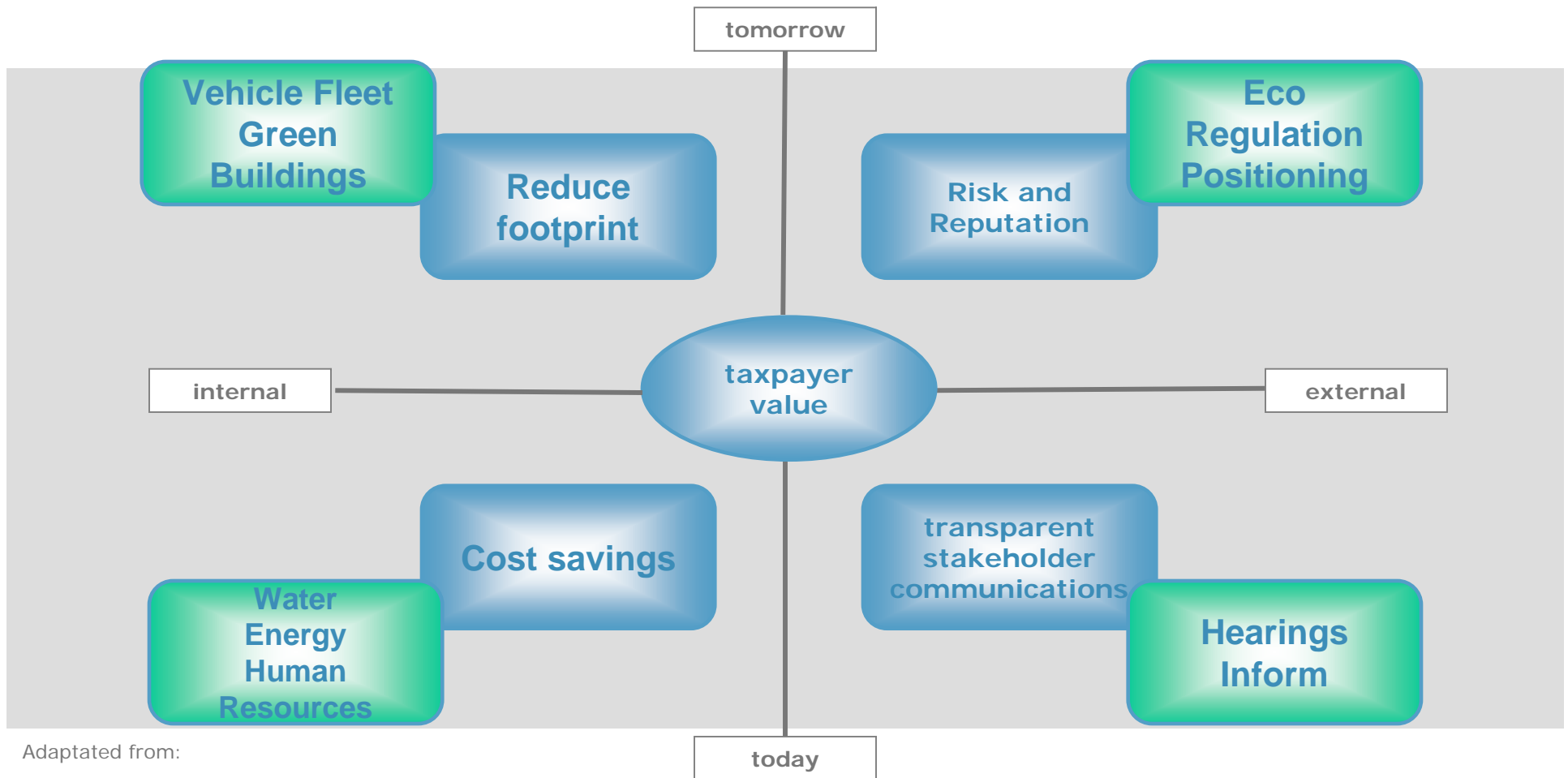
