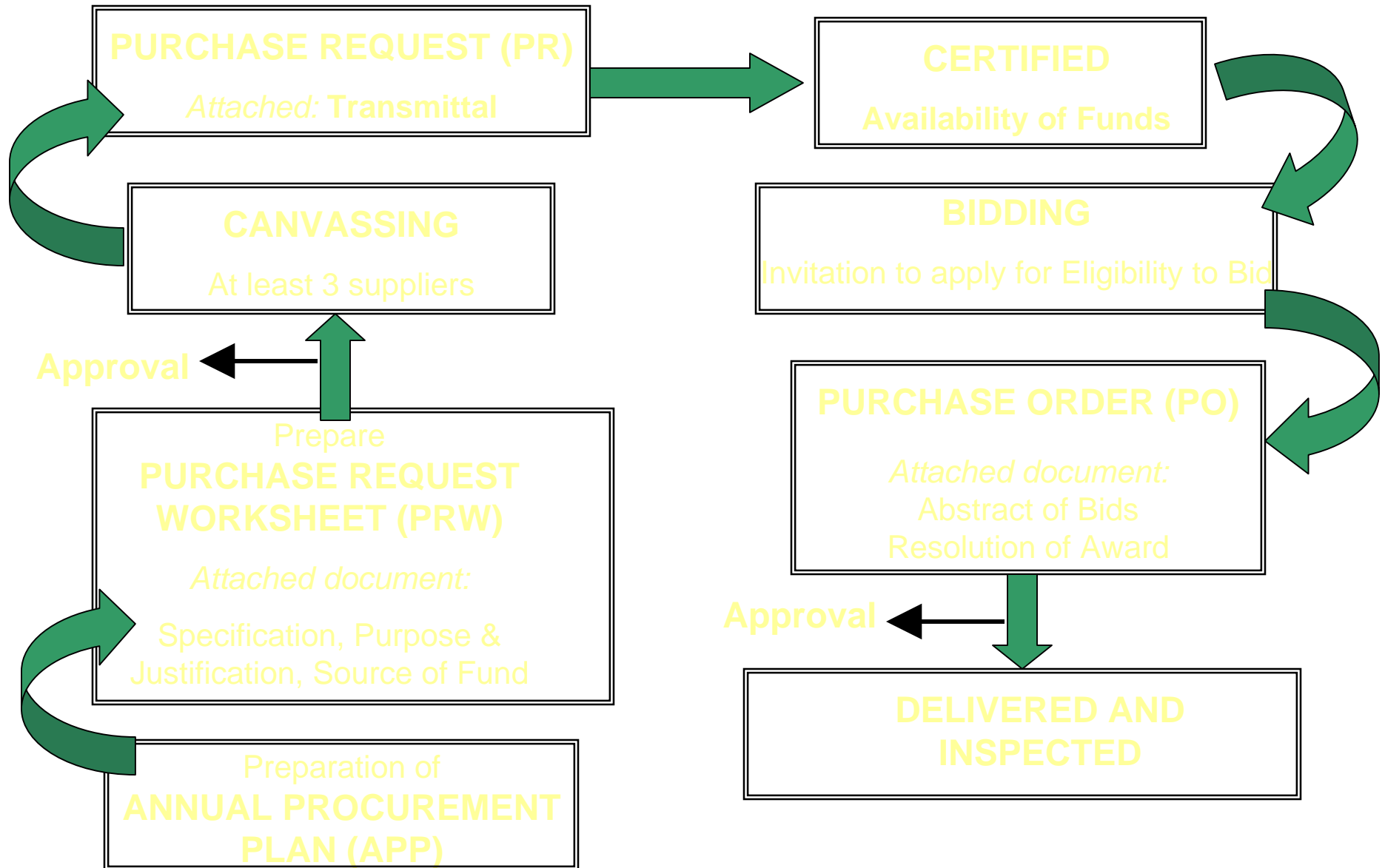

City Procurement Systems



Practices in Makati

- Switching demand from conventional purchasing to green purchasing
- The end-user which is the department/office requests the type of item to be procured
- The City has adopted the policy that mandates sustainable procurement
- Environmentally preferable alternatives widely available for electricity, IT equipments & services



Practices in Makati

- Procurement of energy efficient lights for streetlights : High pressure sodium lamps (HPS)
- Coupled with energy saving schemes generates savings of \$7,000 monthly or \$84,000 annually
- Request for energy efficient air condition units, fax machines & other It related equipments.
- Programmable control units for lights



Practices in Makati

- Solid waste management – utilization of reusable sacks of street sweepers in collecting trash
- Clean Cities Program of USAID
 - City Government focused initially in promoting coco biodiesel
 - In line with Memorandum Circular No. 55
- Utilization of refill ink and toner cartridges
- Installation of water-efficient toilet flush
